Funding Opportunities
<p>Integrated Regional Watershed Management Plan Projects: almost all water related projects. Max Award: no limit *Funding currently available</p>
<p>Prevention or Reduction of Contamination of Groundwater (75025) Projects: any improvements that reduce or prevent contamination of groundwater that serves as a drinking water source. Max Award: \$10 million per project *Funding from Proposition 84 expended, funds could be available in a future water bond</p>
<p>Emergency Clean Water Grant Program (75021) Projects: any improvements that implement emergency actions to ensure safe drinking water. Max Award: \$250,000 per project *Funding currently available</p>
<p>Small Community Infrastructure Improvements for Contaminants (75022) Projects: any improvements for in small community drinking water systems and related actions to meet drinking water standards. Max Award: \$5 million per project, \$15 million, if regional *Funding from Proposition 84 expended, funds could be available in a future water bond</p>
<p>Safe Drinking Water State Revolving Fund Projects: Provides grants and low interest financing for water quality projects. Max Award: \$50 million *Funding currently available</p>
<p>Clean Water State Revolving Fund Program Projects: Provides financing for water quality projects. Max Award: \$50 million *Funding currently available</p>
<p>Local Ground Water Assistance Grants Projects: Provides funding for groundwater data collection, modeling, monitoring and management studies; monitoring programs and installation of equipment; basin management; development of information systems; and other groundwater related work. Max Award: \$250,000 *Funding from Proposition 84 expended, funds could be available in a future water bond</p>
<p>Delta, San Joaquin, and Sacramento River Water Quality Grants Projects: Provides funding to implement Delta water quality improvement projects that protect drinking water supplies. Max Award: varies *Funding from Proposition 84 expended, funds could be available in a future water bond</p>

<p>Water Recycling Funding Program</p> <p>Projects: Provides funding for the planning, design, and construction of water recycling projects.</p> <p>Max Award: Planning - \$75,000 /or/ Project - \$5 million</p>
<p>Clean Up and Abatement Account</p> <p>Projects: Provide funding for the cleanup or abatement of a condition of pollution when there are no viable responsible parties available to undertake the work.</p> <p>Max Award: no limit</p> <p>*Funding currently available</p>
<p>Small Community Wastewater Grants</p> <p>Projects: Provides financing and grant assistance for the planning, design, and construction of publicly-owned wastewater treatment and collection facilities. Grants are available for small communities (i.e., with a population of 20,000 persons, or less) with financial hardship (i.e., annual median household income [MHI] is 80 percent of the Statewide MHI, or less).</p> <p>Max Award: \$10 million</p> <p>*Funding currently available</p>
<p>Orphan Site Cleanup Fund</p> <p>Projects: Provides funding for the assessment and/or cleanup of brownfields sites contaminated by leaking petroleum underground storage tanks where there is no financially responsible party.</p> <p>Max Award: \$1.5 million</p> <p>*Funding currently available</p>
<p>California State Infrastructure Bank</p> <p>Projects: construction of private and public infrastructure</p> <p>Max Award: \$10 million per project</p> <p>*Funding currently available</p>
<p>USDA Rural Development Grants</p> <p>Projects: housing, community facilities, utilities, business opportunities and other services in rural communities</p> <p>Max Award: varies</p> <p>*Funding currently available</p>
