ASSEMBLY COMMITTEE ON UTILITIES AND ENERGY Eduardo Garcia, Chair SB 1213 (Hueso) – As Amended March 16, 2022

SENATE VOTE: 33-0

SUBJECT: Public Utilities Commission and State Energy Resources Conservation and Development Commission: public outreach: community-based organizations

SUMMARY: Requires the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) and the California Energy Commission (CEC) to collaborate and work with existing committees, boards, and community-based organizations to develop and maintain a list of community-based organizations to help ensure adequate public outreach regarding available programs.

EXISTING LAW:

- 1) Establishes and vests the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) with regulatory authority over public utilities. (Article XII of the California Constitution)
- Establishes various committees and boards to advise the CPUC on specified topics, including, among others, the Low-Income Oversight Board, and requires the CPUC to work with community-based organizations to increase participation in programs for lowincome customers, as specified. (Public Utilities Code §382.1)
- Establishes the State Energy Resources Conservation and Development Commission (California Energy Commission (CEC)) with various responsibilities with respect to developing and implementing the state's energy policies. (Public Resources Code §25200 et seq.)

FISCAL EFFECT: The Senate Appropriations Committee determined that the state costs of this bill are not significant and sent the bill to the Senate Floor without a hearing in the Appropriations Committee according to Senate Rule 28.8.

BACKGROUND:

Community-based organization outreach – Today, the CPUC and CEC each implement a widevariety of energy-related programs and adopt critical policies that shape our energy future. In doing so, each agency engages with communities across the state. Currently, the CPUC and CEC each maintain various advisory committees and boards, largely as directed by statute. These include the Low Income Oversight Board at the CPUC, and the Disadvantaged Communities Advisory Committee at both the CPUC and CEC. Additionally, some statutes direct the agencies to outreach to community-based organizations on issues including wildfire mitigation, protocols for public safety power shutoffs, low-income rate assistance, weatherization services, clean energy goals, and others. At a recent CPUC and CEC hosted *En Banc* on affordability, stakeholders commented on the need to have the agencies maintain a shared list of communitybased organizations. According to the CPUC, local government coordinators within their News & Outreach office maintain a list of community-based organizations.

COMMENTS:

- Author's Statement. According to the author, "SB 1213 is a simple measure to ensure the state's energy agencies the CPUC and CEC are actively conducting outreach to community-based organizations (CBOs). The bill is a response to an explicit request by CBOs at a public workshop (En Banc) focused on affordability. Between the CEC and CPUC, there are a myriad of programs, policies, and projects related to energy that affect many communities across our state. Ensuring the agencies are maintaining a list of CBOs to conduct outreach regarding these programs will help ensure the voices of those most affected have the opportunity to inform these important decisions."
- 2) Need for more involvement with community-based organizations. Given the diverse geography, demographics, and large population of our state, the CEC and CPUC continue to expand their efforts to conduct outreach to community-based organizations in order to better involve them in the agency policy and program decisions to help inform, shape, support outreach to, and better reflect the diverse needs of the state. In some cases, the requirements of this bill may already be implemented, but greater coordination and broader outreach are laudable goals.
